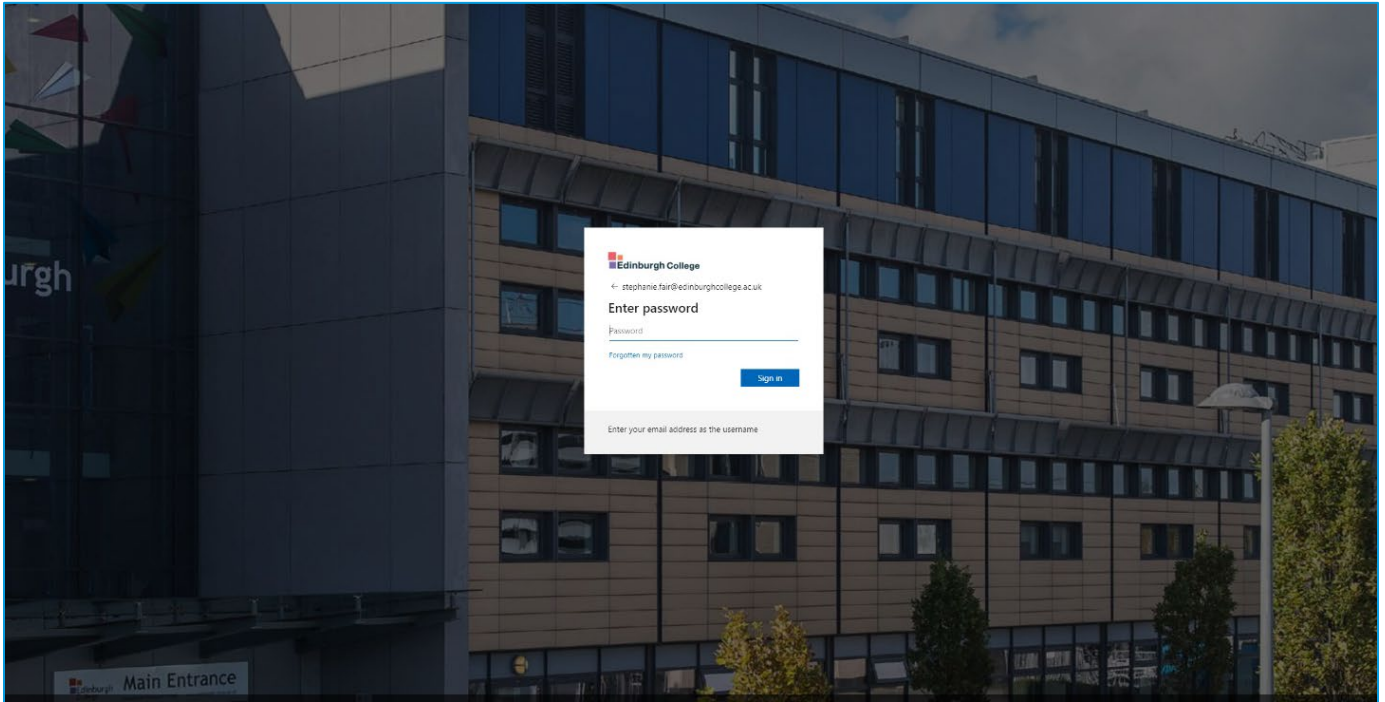
Ecore is our library search tool which allows you to search, access and download our ebooks.

You can search for all of our ebooks via Ecore. Click on the link to Ecore found on your [Subject Guide](#) or [Ecore webpage](#).

After clicking to the link to access Ecore, you will be prompted to sign in:




Sign in with your **student email address** (ECXXXX@edinburghcollege.ac.uk) and your **College password**.

You will then see a page which asks you to select preferences regarding **service terms and conditions**. Accept the terms and conditions – and you will then be taken to the Ecore search screen.

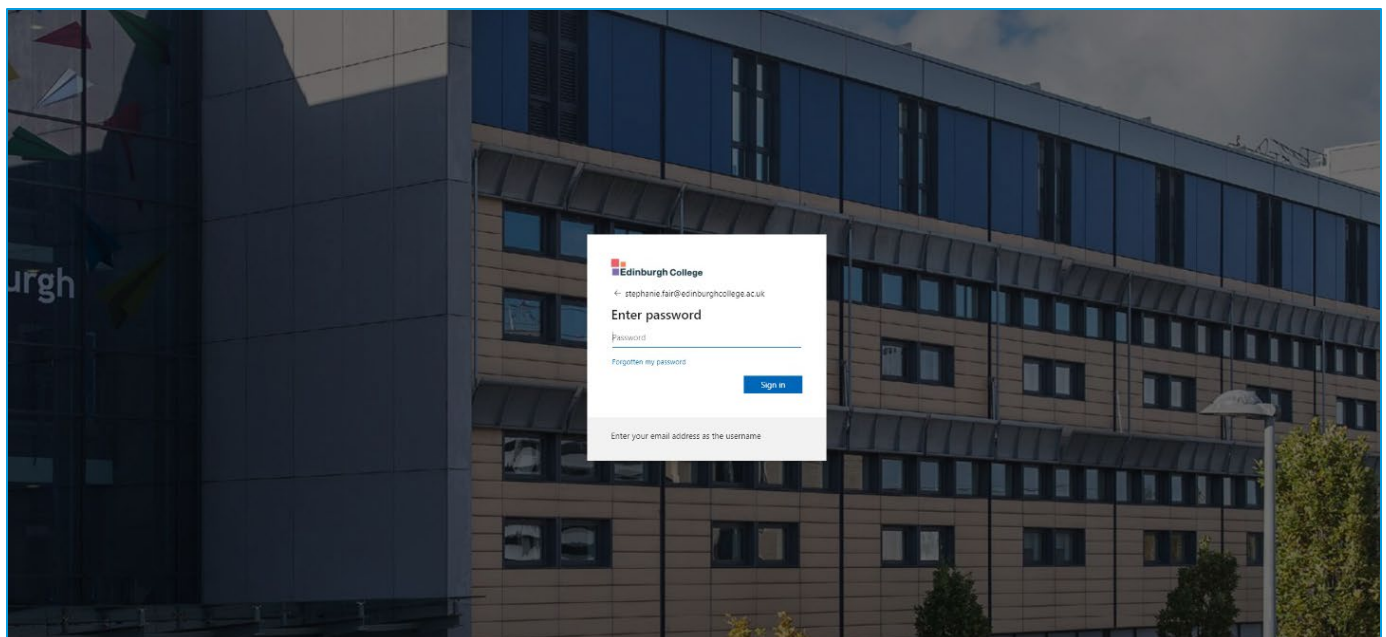
SAVING SEARCH RESULTS


When searching on Ecore, you can save sources you have found to your saved folder, so you can quickly and easily access them again in future.


First you will need to sign into your personal student account. To do this, click on “MyEBSCO” icon on the top right hand corner. Select “sign in” and you will be prompted to sign in with your **student email address and password**.


